



AlertOC is a regional public mass notification system that the City of Tustin is utilizing to provide important information during emergency events. The City of Tustin is encouraging everyone who lives and works in the City to register with Orange County's AlertOC.

What it is- AlertOC is a joint County/City mass notification system designed to keep residents and businesses informed of emergencies. It can be activated on regional, citywide, or neighborhood specific levels to deliver messages directly to affected individuals via phone, email, or text. The system currently uses landline phone numbers only.

How it works- Based on the severity of an event, AlertOC may be used by the City to contact residents by one or all of the following methods: home phone, work phone, cell phone, email, text message. When there is an emergency event requiring community action, authorized officials will create a voice, email or text message that is then delivered quickly to individuals affected by the event. Officials will use the system to keep affected communities informed of event information as necessary. Fires, road closures, or public health incidents are a few examples of when the system may be used.

What to do- Residents and businesses are strongly encouraged to register their personal contact preferences into the confidential database in order to provide alternative means of contacting you during an emergency event. By registering with AlertOC, time-sensitive voice messages from the County or City may be sent to your home, cell or business phone. Text messages may also be sent to cell phones, email accounts and hearing impaired receiving devices.
