Sale of Tustin Property to Orange County Rescue Mission for Homeless Veterans' Housing in Escrow

TUSTIN, Calif. – On Tuesday, February 10, 2015, City officials formally signed escrow documents for the sale of two city-owned fourplexes to the Orange County Rescue Mission (OCRM) for homeless veterans' housing. The Tustin City Council unanimously approved the sale of the property to the OCRM at its December 16, 2014 meeting. The property, located on Newport Avenue, is slated to close escrow in the next couple of weeks.

“We owe so much to our veterans and military,” said Mayor Chuck Puckett. “Given Tustin’s rich military history, it’s exciting to know that this Council has played a small part in creating transitional housing for those veterans in need.”

Each fourplex has two (2) three bedroom units, one (1) two bedroom unit, one (1) bedroom unit, a laundry room and four garage spaces. The OCRM plans on renovating the units and upon completion, an estimated 32 people will be housed at site.
